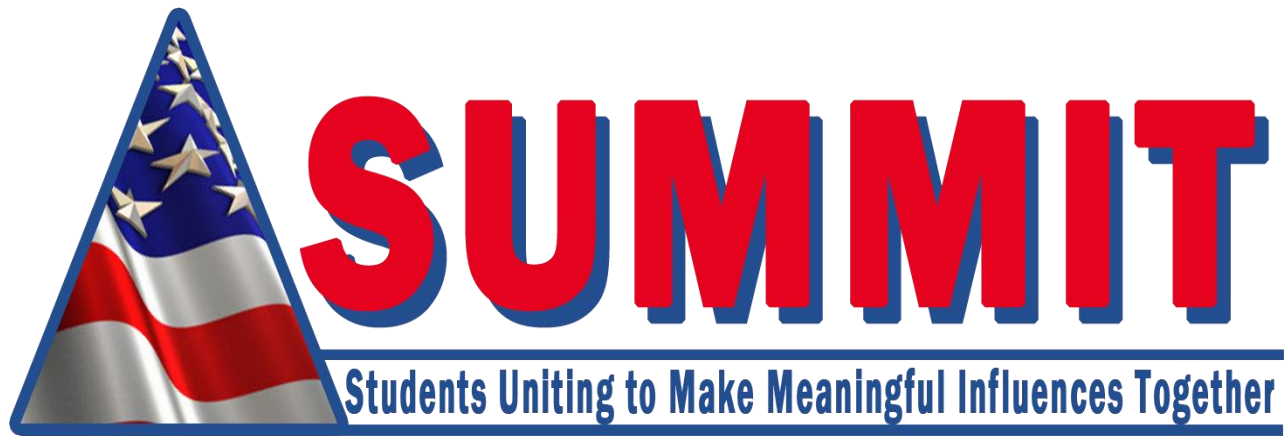

John Wayne Walding



John Wayne Walding is a former U.S. Army Green Beret (Special Forces) soldier, known for his heroic actions during the Afghanistan War.

Walding was awarded the Silver Star for his bravery and heroism during a fierce battle in 2008

where Walding was severely wounded, losing his lower leg. Despite his injury, he continued to fight, provide medical assistance, and help his team until they were able to withdraw.

John Wayne Walding speaks about his experiences as a Green Beret, particularly his heroism during the 2008 Shok Valley firefight in Afghanistan, where he continued to fight and assist his team despite losing his leg. His talks focus on themes of leadership, perseverance, and teamwork, emphasizing the importance of resilience in overcoming adversity.
